Local Districts Will Feel the Squeeze of Measures 58 and 60
Measures will take over \$600 million dollars out of Oregon schools

OR-Ballot Measures 58 and 60, two anti-education initiatives being pushed by Bill Sizemore, will cost Oregon schools over \$600 million, taking money away from where our schools need it most – in the classroom.

Estimates are attached for the district-by-district cost of Measure 58. However, Measure 60 is so vague and poorly worded that it is unclear how much it will cost individual districts. Neither Measure 58 nor 60 specifies a dedicated funding source, meaning that the more than \$600 million dollars needed to implement these measures would come directly out of taxpayers' pockets, local school budgets and the state's general fund.

“Bill Sizemore is asking Oregonians to spend over half a billion dollars on undefined programs, without knowing how the programs will work, who qualifies or what the results will be. Measures 58 and 60 are simply too confusing and costly for Oregon schools,” says Chuck Bennett, Confederation of School Administrators.

The district-by-district impact from these one-size-fits-all mandates is severe. For example, Measure 58 will cost Salem-Keizer School District an estimated \$22.2 million per year. But even smaller districts will feel the sting of Measure 58. Ione School District, one of Oregon's smallest with only 137 students, will spend nearly \$50,000 dollars on this undefined program. That's money better spent adding in lost programs or buying more textbooks.
